

ON-SITE GUIDELINES

BUILDER RESPONSABILITY

It is the responsibility of the principal contractor to ensure that these guidelines are implemented and controlled.

OUTDOOR WORK

Workers should keep a distance of 1.5m-2m between themselves and others at all times.

INDOOR WORK

No more than 1 worker for each 4m² when working indoors.

GROUPS AND QUEUES

Gathering in groups or queues of any size is strictly not allowed. Keep your distance at hoists and lifts.

EMPLOYER PROVISIONS FOR GOOD HYGIENE

Every effort must be made by employers to upgrade personal hygiene and minimise person to person contact. All workers must co-operate in all necessary measures to achieve these objectives.



Employers must facilitate regular hand washing by providing easy and ready access and additional facilities wherever needed.



Employers must provide suitable personal and protective equipment, including single use gloves, where workers are in close proximity.



Employers must increase the frequency and scope of cleaning, housekeeping measures, and decontamination across all areas of their site.



Employers must provide hand sanitiser in all hoists, amenities rooms and in easy access on all levels of their site.

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CONTROLS FOR COMMON AREAS

Common areas on-site, such as crib rooms and amenities pose risks. These risks are greatly reduced by ensuring the following measures are adopted.

The time spent in common areas and amenities should be limited so each worker is spending as little time in those areas as possible.

Meal breaks and other breaks should be staggered or separated into different work groups to minimise contact between groups and limit the number of people in those spaces at one time.

Furniture should be spread out and arranged to maximise distance between workers and promote good social isolation, even in these shared spaces.

4

Special attention should be paid to amenities and common areas with increased frequency of industrial grade cleaning and a specific emphasis on intensive cleaning after every meal break.

5

Workers are encouraged to minimise amenity access wherever possible. Only go where you need to. Only use what you need to. Only touch what you need to.

All sites should consider staggering work hours or amending work schedules, in consultation with workers, to maintain a maximum distance between individual workers, trade groups, and contractors on site.
